

Amuria Recieves 10 Billion Shillings For Third Quarter of 2024/2025 FY

he Ministry of Finance, Planning and Economic Development has released 10,190,439,600 (ten billion one hundred and ninety million, four hundred and thirty nine thousand six hundred shillings) for the third quarter of 2024/2025. The third quarter release caters for the months of January, February Economic Development has released funds amounting to 10,190,439,600, the purpose of this communication is to declare the funds released" The letter read in part.

Minister Odongo Launches Works on 16KM road in Ogolai Sub County

HE MINISTER of Foreign Affairs Hon Jeje Odongo has on Wednesday March 19th launched the rehabilitation of Acedayapo-Akore road in Ogolai subcounty. The 16-Kilometer road is expected to cost 1.2 billion shillings and is being funded by government of Uganda with partnership with the International Fund for Agricultural Development.

Minister Odongo while launching the rehabilitation works on the road , encouraged local farmers to engage in commercial agriculture especially on the oil seeds such as soya, sunflower and groundnuts among others. "This road is going to be in good shape soon, but for us to reap its benefit all of us should get into meaningful agriculture especially on oil seeds" Odongo said. The Chief Administrative Officer Amuria Ms Angella Akurut emphasized the need for the contractor to do quality work so as to ensure value for money is achieved.

"For me as the accounting officer I will ensure through my technical staff that quality work is done so as to ensure value for money" Akurut Noted. The contract to rehabilitate the road has been awarded to M/S ShajapaTechnical works limited. The rehabilitation of the road is expected to be complete in three months' time.

Once complete, the road is expected to accelerate commercial agriculture in key oilseeds value chains and there by improve the livelihoods and resilience of smallholder farmers engaged in oilseed production and marketing.

Abarilela Sub County Receives Piped Water Project Worth 900 Million UGX



"When this project is completed, we shall hand it over to the water board who will charge you a small fee for purposes of management," **Ms. Harriet** Agemo the Programme Manager **WeltHungerHilfe**

muria district local government in partnership with .WelthungerHilfe a German non-governmental organization, launched a multi-million solarpowered piped water project at Abarilela Rural Growth centre, Abarilela sub-county, Amuria district.

The project is estimated to cost 915,910,354/ Ugx (Nine hundred and fifteen million, nine hundred and ten thousand, three hundred and fifty four shillings) and is fully funded by the Charity Water Project.

Speaking during the launch of the project, Amuria district Resident District Commissioner (RDC) Mr. Imran Muluga, said the project will improve access to safe and clean water in Abarilela sub-county and the neighboring communities. "This project will mark a significant milestone in improving access to clean water for communities as well as providing a sustainable solution to water scarcity in the area," Muluga said. The district local council five chairperson, Mr. Moses Emabu also emphasized the need for community contributions in fostering the operation

and maintenance of the piped water project in order to keep supporting the local communities.

"As we launch this project our focus as the leadership of Amuria district will be on operation and maintenance, we are going to ensure that communities contribute a small fee that can enable us sustain the project" Emabu said.

According to Ms. Harriet Agemo the Programme Manager WeltHungerHilfe, the project will be undertaken by SB Innovations Limited and will benefit 2,109 persons in the initial year. She says that once the system is fully functional, the facility will be handed over to the district water board for management.

Under the project's initial subsidized connections, 60 yard taps will be installed while 10 Public Standpipe sys-



tems will also be installed with the aim of easing access to safe clean water. The project also has various components that include construction of a pump house, guard house and an ecosan toilet facility and it is expected to be complete by April 2025.

NARO PARTNERS WITH FAO TO BOOST COFFEE PRODUCTION IN AMURIA

EXPERT VIEW

The Director of Research at NARO, Dr. Nasser Kasozi revealed that the organization has so far introduced and distributed over 10 different varieties of Robusta coffee and will soon introduce Arabica coffee to cater for highland ecologies and boost the livelihoods of farmers.

Kasozi also noted that NARO has generated over 1,000 technologies in areas of crops, and farmer's livelihoods.

Mr. David Dickens Ogwang, the FAO field office coordinator for Lango and Teso sub regions emphasized the need for sustainability, ownership, and adoption of the interventions by farmers to improve their livelihoods before the project expires.

The district leaders led by the Assistant Resident District Commissioner, Ms. Proscovia Arongo commended NARO and FAO for the initiative to always guide farmers on selecting the right seeds that suits the environment. n a bid to eradicate poverty among farmers in communities, the National Agricultural Research Organization (NARO) has partnered with the Food and Agricultural Organization (FAO) to boost coffee production in Amuria district.

This was revealed during the seed fair exhibition held at Kuju sub-county headquarters and organized by NARO, FAO and the Amuria district local government. The event brought together farmers, agricultural experts, and local leaders within the Teso sub-region and aimed at sensitizing farmers on the better coffee farming practices.

The initiative is part of the five-year project funded by the government of Uganda and the Global Environment Facility with the aim to integrate climate resilience into agricultural and pastoral production in communities. The project is now supporting at least five f isheries, livestock and agro-machinery over the years with the aim of boosting food security, different farmers in Amuria to grow coffee on five acres by providing them with the necessary seedlings, technical knowledge, and other support to ensure success.

According to Amuria District Agricultural Officer, Mr. Moses Okim the project is so far yielding positive results to farmers despite the challenges as a result of climate change.

She also pledged government's support to the organizations in implementing their programs.





WERA HEALTH CENTER III ELEVATED TO HEALTH CENTER IV • Construction of New Facilities Commences

he elevation of Wera Health Centre III to Health Centre IV in Amuria district has kicked off with the construction of new facilities.

The district officials led by the Resident District Commissioner (RDC) Hajji Imran Muluga, a team comprising of the political and technical staff conducted a joint monitoring exercise aimed at ensuring good quality work in the construction of facilities and were impressed by the work progress.

"The progress and quality of the work done in this facility is so far good," Muluga said. block, a four stance VIP pit latrine and a medical waste pit. The construction works also include the remodeling of the existing maternity ward.

Amuria District Proposes Shs.35BN Budget for 2025/'26 Financial Year

muria district has laid a proposed budget of Sh35,239,458 for the financial year 2025/2026 before council.

This budget was presented during a council session on March 27, 2025, which was presided over by District Speaker, Mr. Charles Otim. The motion to lay the budget was tabled to council by Hon. Kokas Erusu, the Secretary for Finance, and seconded by Hon. Alwao Esther, the councilor representing women from Akeriau Sub County.


The proposed budget reflects a strategic allocation of resources The production sector has been allocated Sh1, 953,904, while roads and engineering projects will receive Sh1,463,658. This investment underlines the district's commitment to improving educational facilities and opportunities for its youth. Funding for the budget is anticipated to come from various sources, including locally raised revenues, discretionary government transfers, and programme conditional government transfers.

Additionally, external financing and other government transfers will play an integral role in supporting the proposed budget.

While presenting the budget speech, Hon. Erusu expressed optimism about the budget's potential to bring about positive changes in the lives of Amuria residents. "This budget is a reflection of our commitment to improving the lives of the people of Amuria District for social economic transformation," Erusu stated. District Speaker Charles Otim urged council members to engage critically with the budget documents to facilitate informed decision making during discussions leading to its approval in May.

The theme for this year's budget is centered around the full monetization of Uganda's economy, with a focus on commercial agriculture, industrialization, and digital transformation.

Amuria Gets 51,000 Doses to Curb Outbreak

muria district has received 51,000 doses of foot and mouth disease vaccines from the ministry of Agriculture **Animal Industry** and fisheries to support the efforts in controlling the outbreak.

The ministry has allocated UGX 10.2 million shillings to facilitate the vac-

According to Dr Peter Cheli the vaccination has already commenced in all the sub counties in the district. "We have started administering the vaccines in subcounties to protect livestock and contain the outbreak" Dr Cheli said.

He said the funds provided will be used for mobilization, awareness campaigns, maintenance of vaccination equipment, and covering allowances and fuel expenses for veterinary teams.

ducation stakeholders in Amuria district have unanimously agreed to work together so as better performance of learners during final examinations. The move was resolved during a stakeholders meeting of head teachers, deputy head teachers, School management Committee and Parents Teachers Association chairpersons. The meeting was convened following concerns from Moses Emabu the Local Council Five Chairperson over poor performance of learners especially during primary leaving examinations. In the 2024 primary leaving examinations that were released by Uganda National Examinations Board, 42 pupils passed in division, 1,205 in division 2, 1,146 IN Division 3,536 in division 4 while 684 were ungraded. Of the 3,642 pupils that registered to sit for the examinations, 29 did not



for final examinations.

"Let's make use of the examiners that we have within the district to build capacity of our teachers so that they can deliver results" Amao noted. Speaking at the same event Angella Akurut the Chief Administrative Officer Amuria implored teachers to love their work saying failure by teachers to do so is responsible for low coverage of the syllabus which directly affects the performance of learners. "The teaching profession is a calling, so you should love your calling "Akurut Noted" Moses Emabu the district chairperson Amuria warned of turf action against Headteachers who defy the set resolutions. "We have resolved that lets better our results, I now request you to follow the resolutions to dot, failure to do so , my office will take an action" Emabu noted.

MICRO PROJECTS HELP BOOST HOUSEHOLD INCOME IN AMURIA

icro projects are helping to boost household incomes in Amuria . Government through Teso Affairs ministry with support from the Office of the Prime minister recently sent funds for supporting micro projects with the view of helping households improve of their incomes. In Amuria district, the beneficiaries of the ten million fund include Akeriau women cattle rearing project and Asilang women's welfare Association.

For Asilang women's welfare association, the group bought 130 chairs and two tents for hire. Teresa Ateme the chairperson of Asilang Women's Welfare Association says that her of 21 members is earning daily income from the hire of chairs and tents. "Since we got this support from Teso Affairs ministry our lives have changed , we are able to get daily income" said Ateme Teresa the chairperson of the group.

Through savings, the group is planning to buy a public address system in order to boost their incomes. Asilang women welfare association members are not alone whose incomes have been boosted, Akeriau women cattle rearing project members are also beaming in joy thanks to the support they got from the office of the prime minister. Akeriau women cattle rearing project with a membership of twenty members purchased ten heads of cattle for rearing.

Hellen Christine Acheko the chairperson of Akeri-

au women rearing project says they envision to give the offspring's of the cattle to other members of the group. Since cattle rearing is a long term project, the group is also engaged in savings Edmond Malinga the Community Development Officer Amuria who is in charge of micro projects says the beneficiaries have put the money in proper use.

Abeko Health Centre III was upgraded to the current status during the 2022/2023 financial year thanks to the government's plan of making health service delivery accessible to all people. The upgrade facilitated the construction of a maternity ward, pit latrines, a placenta pit, medical waste pit, an incinerator and now a twin staff house.


